Propagation Plants for MCTMN Native Plant Sale

The following is the list of plants that we'd like to have folks volunteer to propagate. These plants are native or adapted to our area, have value for wildlife, and will be sellable (i.e. robust and/or blooming) at the time of the HummerBird Celebration (Sep 16-18, 2022). Many of these plants are hard to find in commercial nurseries. To maximize sales, we need to have healthy plants that look like they've been professionally grown. Prune, trim, and fertilize as necessary to make the plants look good. It is also important for the plants to be in standard plant pots—primarily 4" and 1 gallon pots. Contact the PPT Coordinator (Cathy Koenig) if you need pots. Also let the PPT Coordinator know if you plan to have more than 6-8 pots of any species. Note: We do not sell annuals, because the plants would not overwinter for our customers.
